




Q2 Do you feel there is a need for additional behavioral/mental health education, specialized training, or additional resources for fire investigators?





Q3 How many years have you worked in public-sector fire investigations, fire service, or law enforcement?





Q4 How many years have you worked in private-sector fire investigations (including the insurance industry or testifying in court as a subject matter expert)?



Q5 Have you utilized behavioral or mental health services due to experiences related to your duties as a fire investigator?















Q11 If Yes to the previous question, did it negatively affect your daily life outside of work or the daily life of your family?





Q12 Does your public agency or private sector company offer behavioral or mental health services for fire investigators that you are aware of?




